Billingham Forum 50th Birthday Celebrations



In 1967, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II visited the town of Billingham to cut the ribbon and officially open the iconic leisure centre, Billingham Forum. Fifty years on and the North East's most popular leisure centre is planning a week of exciting events and entertainment to mark the landmark birthday.

The schedule of events will run throughout the October half term from Monday 23rd to Friday 27th October and will welcome entertaining performances from local favourites, the Van Dunk Brothers and Urban Kaos, hair raising demonstrations from Cool Science Party and an exotic petting zoo from Stockton based Animal Story. A number of celebratory themed climbing sessions are planned in the family attraction GoClimb, as well as a UV party in the ice arena and performances and exhibitions from local community organisations.

Facility Manager, Roy Broadbent explains "Everyone is really looking forward to the

week, the Forum has always been at the heart of the community and we want as much involvement as possible from the people who have helped to make the centre such a success. We've hosted some fantastic events over the years and welcomed lots of big names from the world of entertainment at the theatre. The 50th Birthday is the perfect opportunity to share our stories and come together to celebrate what has made Billingham great."

To commemorate the milestone, Tees Active have commissioned an anniversary video to include original footage of the town and the royal opening, intertwined with present day interviews and footage, as well as an exciting project in partnership with Tees Valley Arts and local schools to produce a number of collaborative pieces.

The Forum's pioneering design was a remarkable feat of engineering and innovation that helped to put Billingham on the map and

since its redevelopment in 2011 has gone from strength to strength, attracting hundreds of thousands of visitors each year and continues to provide fun and engaging leisure activities for local residents and visitors from across the region.



North Tees and Hartlepool NHS Foundation Trust



S smokers in Billingham are being urged to take the first step in giving up cigarettes for good and join the Stoptober quit smoking challenge this year.

While studies show that two-thirds of smokers want to quit, nearly one in five UK adults continue to smoke, including around 19% in Stockton. The NHS Stop Smoking Service is open to all smokers motivated to quit, living within Stockton and Hartlepool areas. You can walk in to any of the drop in sessions without a prior appointment and without referral from your GP or other health professional. You will be offered one-to-one advice and support from trained advisors on nicotine replacement treatments/ medications, and, if appropriate, prescriptions for appropriate treatment. You can also have your level of carbon monoxide gas monitored and many people feel very encouraged by being able to see the progress they are making; as they see the fall in carbon monoxide in their body when they stop smoking.


Raf Rashid (Specialist Stop Smoking Advisor) said: "We understand that the majority of smokers want to stop smoking, but many find the task too daunting. Stoptober is the perfect opportunity to inspire smokers in Stockton to quit for good. With support, smokers are more likely to succeed in their quit attempt. Smokers are 4 times more likely to quit smoking successfully by attending the NHS Stop Smoking provision.



That is why Stockton & Hartlepool Specialist Stop Smoking Service will be out in force during Stoptober, promoting the campaign and highlighting range of local services and resources available to help make their quit attempt easier."

The best chance for quitting smoking in England is to use your local NHS Stop Smoking Service, which offers behavioural support and coaching, and prescriptions for a stop smoking medicine such as nicotine replacement therapy or varenicline.

Thirteen at the heart of Billingham's communities

Thirteen is working in communities across Billingham to help neighbourhoods and customers with a variety of innovative projects.

One project which is helping customers of Thirteen is the gardening equipment loan scheme.

Customers can hire a range of gardening tools to help them with work needed on their gardens in the run-up to winter.

Thirteen's neighbourhood officers can access equipment that customers can borrow for a small refundable deposit; this includes lawnmowers, strimmers, forks and spades.

Customers can hire equipment from the tool lending scheme by contacting their neighbourhood officer, booking the equipment and paying a £5 deposit which will be refunded when the equipment is returned.




Service 33 - Wolviston - Billingham

ROYAL BRITISH LEGION BILLINGHAM BRANCH

GREAT PILGRIMAGE 90

The Royal British Legion announced plans for the **Great Pilgrimage 90 (GP90)**. This event, which will take place on the **8th August 2018**, the biggest ever membership event to date, is to meet the Legions charitable remit in its Royal Charter of Remembrance. This will help to ensure that the enduring responsibility of Remembrance is understood and embraced across the nation, and the torch of remembrance is passed on from generation to generation.

GP90 provides this excellent opportunity to demonstrate this aim.

GP90 will be a modern day recreation of the original tour in 1928. When the Last Post Association was founded. The Last Post Ceremony is carried out every night and has been so since its foundation in 1928.

The aim is to bring two representatives from local branches and their communities in an act of remembrance at the Menim Gate in Ypres. Members of each branch will be selected, one to be standard bearer and one to carry a wreath, each wreath will carry a message of remembrance, written by school children. These wreaths will be collected during the ceremony and subsequently built into a display within the Commonwealth War Graves Commission Grounds that surround the Menim Gate Memorial.

The commemorative event will be followed by a march past of

standards of the entire contingent of more than 2000 Legion Branches and their standards.

The march past will be observed by Civic Dignitaries and Military Guests from both the Commonwealth and Northern Countries of Europe.

It is the intention of the Billingham Branch, Royal British Legion to be represented at this prestigious event and parade. The Branch will parade their standard and lay a wreath on behalf of the Billingham Community.

If anyone would like to attend this event as a spectator, the Legion is putting on a parallel tour in partnership with Leger Holidays to encourage as much community participation as possible. As well as attending the GP90 event, the tour will also visit Mons, Nimy Bridge, Loos, Bethune and Fromelles. It will then finish at Ypres on the 8th August to see the official ceremony and attend the Last Post Ceremony. Interested parties contact Tony Curnow 07821 562171.

The Billingham Branch of Royal British Legion have been researching local soldiers from Billingham, Wolviston and Haverton Hill who died in the Great War and are buried in France/Belgium. We have identified 34 soldiers and their war grave cemeteries in France/Belgium and it is the intention of the Branch to send four members to travel to the area five days prior to GP90 and lay a large poppy, and cross at each war grave in each cemetery and hold a short ceremony to those,

from our area, who sacrificed their lives during the Great War. After completing the ceremonial event, the four members will travel to Ypres to meet up with the two branch members attending GP90 at the Menim Gate.

To support this commemorative event we are asking the people of Billingham to Sponsor a poppy and named soldier, for a minimum donation of £10. The sponsors will receive, on return, a photograph of the grave of the sponsored soldier. Should you wish to sponsor this event contact Tony Curnow 07821 562171. If you are a business, however large or small, in the Billingham area and would like to support this event we would like to hear from you.

This is the final year of the 100th Commemoration of those who fell and served in the Great War, we feel it incumbent on our Town not only to be represented at the Menim Gate on the 8th August 2018 but to show our appreciation to those who served and gave their lives in the conflict, especially the residents from our area who remain, in our thoughts, buried in France and Belgium. This apart from civic pride, will clearly demonstrate that,

Sergeant P. Archer, Royal Field Artillery. Died 9th November 1917 age 24. Buried X-Track British Cemetery La Chapelle-d'Armentiers Nord France. Lived 4 Railway Terrace, Haverton Hill.

Trauma comes in all shapes and sizes, and even a minor trauma can trigger a harmful toxic stress response in children. Play Therapy is one of the few interventions that provides an opportunity for younger children to heal from trauma and toxic stress. That's why I'm so passionate about ensuring that as many children in need as possible have access to Play Therapy on Teesside. A tribute to Ada (14.9.42 - 21.8.2017)

The Billingham Silvertones Junior Jazzband was formed in 1967, wearing uniforms sporting the colours of red, black and silver. Ada was the pillar of the band for more years than I can remember, in the later years, she was the sole person who kept the band running until 1997 when the band closed its doors.

Not only did Ada train the band, she was the person who made the uniforms, arranged the competitions, made up the moves and picked the tunes. She took on the mammoth task of fundraising to buy instruments and pay for the bus to take the children to competitions up and down the country, including week long holidays to take part in the UK Championships.

You may be surprised to know that Ada was a Jazzband trainer, but could not play any of the instruments! Ada overcame this by singing the tunes she wanted the children to learn, and they picked up the notes playing by ear. She was very creative in her displays, using musical tunes ranging from nursery rhymes, like Pop Goes the Weasel, to George Formby's Leaning on the Lamppost, or a personal favourite of mine Wish Me Luck as You Wave Me Goodbye.

Ada was often seen cleaning the church hall where the band practised as a way to pay for the hall hire, she never stopped because whatever her 'kids' needed they would have. When I say her 'kids' I don't just mean her own daughters, but every single member of the band, past and present.

I vividly remember Ada fund raising at the Kiosk in Billingham town centre, with the bands banner (which she made herself) displayed proudly to advertise what she was fundraising for. She worked tirelessly, and her daughters remember getting up one morning to find Ada has stayed up all night to make thirty new hats to make sure they were ready for the next competition.

On competition days Ada's place was always the first seat on the bus, she would bring with her a giant packed lunch to make sure none of her 'kids' went hungry. When we marched on display we would hear her cheering us on. She never missed a competition.

There are not enough words to describe what Ada meant to hundreds of children who passed through the doors of the Billingham Silvertones Jazzband. She did more than work hard to give children a hobby. She kept us on the straight and narrow, off the streets, and took us to places we would otherwise never have seen.

Ada provided a family, a place where it didn't matter if you could not afford to pay your weekly subs, or didn't dress in the latest styles, you were welcome. It was a place where we were taught to look after each other, bullying was unheard of, and everyone was amazing (even if we weren't!). She built confidence, and taught us to that it was okay not to win every time, as long as we tried our best and enjoyed what we were doing.

Ada had an infectious laugh, which still makes me smile when I think of her, and an amazing sense of humour which got us all through some sticky situations like when the Jazzband bus would often break down and we would be pushing it up a hill.

Overall the thing that is truly special about Ada is her heart, she loved unconditionally, and she never judged. The work she did within the community will never be forgotten, and I am eternally grateful for the belief she showed in me, and the time she spent guiding me through my teenage years. I know I am not alone when I say that others feel exactly the same as I do.

There was a song the band sang to the tune of Don't cry for me Argentina –

*We are the Billingham Silvertones,
The best band in the land,
And thanks to Ada Jordan,
United we will stand,
She trains us in our hospitality,
And thinks we're really good,
And when we go to carnivals,
We win just like we should!*

*We're heading for victory,
Like no other bands achieve
We're going to win the World
And we are going to win the UK
Because we are the best.*



We never did win a World title, but we got something much more valuable, lifelong friends. The lyrics still stand true today; Ada did unite the band and the community.

Ada was and will remain a true inspiration to many people, she will be sadly missed. Thanks for everything Ada.

One of the young people taking part in the NCS programme, Amir Davies, 17, of Stockton, explained: "The programme gives you a lot of skills and confidence. It also gives you a strong work ethic as well."

Adam Allen, 16, of Guisborough added: "It has been an enjoyable experience and it is good to know you are helping out the community at the same time."

On Wednesday, 30 August, BCT Aspire's Paul Burgum set off on a massive 10-day trek, walking the Wainwright Coast to Coast (St Bees Head to Robin Hood's Bay) route barefoot. That's 192 miles across open terrain in bare feet!

Paul completed this extreme challenge to raise money for BCT Aspire Community Interest Company, a local youth group which Paul founded. BCT Aspire aims are to raise the aspirations of young people in the local area and currently runs 4 youth sessions per week as well running a Duke of Edinburgh Awards group. Speaking to Paul afterwards about his reason for taking on such a mammoth task, "I want to show these kids what's possible and how far we can go. At BCT we tell our kids all of the time that they can do anything they put their mind to and this is my show me the money moment. There were times when I felt like I couldn't take another step, especially on the last day. There were people telling me I was so close to the end and it just messed with my head. However, by focussing on the small wins, whether it's a stranger offering words of encouragement or just a smooth stretch of tarmac with no stones or gravel, to build you back up."

The money raised means that BCT have already been able to invest in the garden at the BCT den with a fence to secure the space, ensure that new double-glazed windows are installed before the winter starts and are hoping to purchase a minibus for the trips they organise for the Duke of Edinburgh group and the Youth Club.



30 Hour Free Childcare

Working parents of children aged 3 and 4 years old could now be entitled for up to 30 hours free childcare a week.

Working includes employed persons, self-employed persons, and parents on zero hours contracts who meet the criteria.

A child qualifies for free childcare if they are resident in the England and under compulsory school age:

- Both parents are working (or the sole parent in a lone parent family) and each parent earns, on average:
- A weekly minimum wage equivalent to 16 hours at national minimum wage or national living wage; and
- Less than £100,000 per year.
