# Do I need a Will?

A Will is simply an expression of wishes as to what should happen to your estate when you die. There are a number of types of Wills and Trusts that can be created when writing your Will to protect things that are important to you. This could be property, ensuring someone who is disabled is looked after, as you would have wanted as well as specifying your funeral wishes or appointing guardians for your children.

# What is a funeral plan?

Funeral plans allow you to pre-pay your funeral. It means that your family won't need to worry about the cost of the funeral when the time comes. It also means that the cost you have paid will be fixed and will not rise with inflation.

# What is the difference between a funeral plan and the over 50s policies?

Funeral plans are generally seen as the "peace of mind" option for most people. You

can pay in full or there are companies that offer interest free options and some allow you to pay over ten years. Most Funeral plans also have an allowance for third party costs such as crematorium and doctors fees.

With an over 50s policy, you will be given a fixed monthly payment which you will pay until you reach a certain age. You will need to pay into this for a period of time, normally two years, before any money will be paid out. You could end up paying more in to the plan than the policy will pay out when the time comes. Most providers don't guarantee the cost of your funeral. This option is usually cheaper than a funeral plan when paying on a monthly basis. If you stop paying, all of the money that you have paid in will be lost.

# What is a Power of Attorney?

There are 2 types of Power of Attorney. One for Financial affairs and the other for Health and Welfare. They allow a person or persons that you appoint, to step into your shoes to manage your affairs should you not have the capacity to do so.

Besides especially themed concerts and events, funded by Arts Council





Luke had attended a number of job interviews via the Job Centre; however, none had resulted in employment. Fortunately one day whilst accessing the Job Centre, he met with Five Lamps YEI Support Worker, Anne Rookes

Anne advised Luke that Five Lamps currently have a project where they are supporting 15-29 year olds progress into long term training, employment and education.

Each young person is supported individually according to their needs, however the support can include; help with interview techniques, support with training, travel expenses to interviews and also financial support with interview clothing.

Luke welcomed the support and quickly began working with Anne Rookes to identify his long term career goals, which was eventually to join the Army. Luke attended North Shore Academy, achieving Travel and Tourism Level 1 and a BTEC Level 1 Construction, Fire and Rescue. Luke also attended Stockton Riverside College, achieving both Maths and English Level 2.

Anne contacted MPC Teesside (Military Preparation College) and an appointment was made for Luke to speak to staff about his long term career goals. Unfortunately it was identified that this wasn't the right time to pursue his career within the Army and Anne continued to support Luke to identify different job opportunities.

After visiting local supermarkets and Café/bars, Luke successfully secured employment at the Café in Billingham. Luke is very happy with his new employment and is extremely popular with the staff there. Although, Luke has now gained employment, Anne still continues to keep in touch with Luke, offering information, advice and guidance.

Luke said; "Without the support of Anne and the Youth Employment Initiative Project, I would most definitely still be visiting the local job Centre."

The Tees Valley Pathways and Routeways programmes form part of the Youth Employment Initiative (YEI). This is partfunded by the European Social Fund through the 2014-2020 European Structural and Investment Funds Growth Programme in England.



The program aims to support young people across the Tees Valley aged 15-29 who are unemployed and/or not in educations, employment or training until the end of July 2020.



# Remember When...

# **Summer Memories Sink or Swim**



Just up the bank from Billingham Bottoms, Billingham Co-operative stores in their heyday in 1929. The long gone, underground toilet wall can be seen behind the tree, an indicator of Town Status perhaps - similar ones were in Middlesbrough and Stockton.

t would seem absurd today to realise that Billingham Bottoms was once a popular place for children to play and a place for summer picnics beside Billingham beck as it flowed towards the river. This pleasing aspect probably originated from the early days of Billingham when St Cuthbert's church was central to the people of Billingham's spiritual guidance. My Uncle, Christopher Jelley killed in 1944, whist serving in Bomber Command, lived in nearby Imperial Road and was a young chorister and soloist there, and like many, his parents came down from the Tyne looking for work.

St Cuthbert's church, with its 1000 years old Saxon tower, was where the dead Saint was briefly rested, and stands at the top of the slope which rose from the flood plane of the Bottoms. Heavy autumn and spring rains always brings substantial flooding to the Bottoms, none worse than in 1927 when the old A19 was under water as it passed the Bottoms on its meandering way though Billingham on its way, past the old station to Wolviston village and beyond

The area around the church grew with the small housing estate for employees of the Newcastle Electric Supply Company, (NESCO), later the North Eastern Electricity Board. (NEEB). This small estate, built at the top of the bank, comprised Old Road and South, West, Middle and East Avenues.

NESCO's sports and social club fronted onto the once cobbled main road and behind, down East Avenue was their small cricket field. On the other side of the road back to back with those overlooking the green stood a row of rather decrepit old buildings, representing an earlier age of Billingham.

The coming of 'The Synthetic,' the forerunner of ICI Billingham, created even more houses. The Chilton Estate, on the doorstep of ICIs West gate, had street names like Belasis, Chilton and Tibbersley which were derived from the farms which were taken over for the building of the new factory. The Synthetic's founding fathers are also remembered by the roads Brunner, Mond, and Roscoe.

There was no problem naming the streets of the new estate beside the old station. Many of its residents had moved down from the Glasgow area to work in the new factory. Nick named Scotch town, names like Malvern, Pentland, Cheviot, and Grampion were reminders of home.

So before what we called the New Estate, built from the late

1940s onwards, this area was Billingham. Once called 'The Village.'

On its Green stood the 1852 Church of England school and its nearby shops were dominated by the ubiquitous Co-Operative stores, known to everyone as simply Billingham Stores. Here many shopped to claim their much welcome yearly 'divi' and even today, like my wife, many fondly remember their mothers unique check numbers, many years after this very popular scheme finished.

A summers walk down the slope of Chapel Lane, led to the beck and an idealistic picture of those long hot summers of long ago. Here children would splodge or try to swim in the waters, whose depth was regulated by a downstream sluice gate, or fish for sticklebacks, preferably red breasted ones using a small net on the end of a bamboo cane or a jam jar on string with a small hole cut in the lid. Nearby boys played cricket and kites might be flying, constructed in accordance with the instructions given in the comics of the time, like the Eagle, using bamboo cane, and brown paper, held together with string and flour paste,. The small foot bridge across the beck was maintained by BUDC over which the path would follow the route of the beck either to the wooded Willow Garth or to Norton Green with its duck pond where, on a Sunday summers evening, a Sunshine corner was held and prizes awarded, (I won one for being the best singer!).

At the other side of Billingham is Greatham Beck, a short walk down the bridle path from the village of Cowpen Bewley. Reached via the then gated railway crossing, manned in the 1950s by one armed, Bill Hooliston and Mark Wilson, and on past the sewage works to the beck. Here in much deeper water, older lads would swim, just upstream from the waterfall and the outlet from the nearby sewage works, where many elvers could be seen, on its way to Greatham Creak, (as mentioned in the previous issue of BM.)

Just before the beck stood Tot Fenny's cabin, with its Great War soldier's helmet pinned to the gable end and his tied up dog which, as his gate was passed, frightened you to death with its ferocious barking.

Tot sold firewood to residents of Cowpen Bewley and the Cowpen Estate.

It was not just swimmers who enjoyed the lovely summer's country walk along the path to the beck. Julia Pass, for example,

regularly walked there with her father Sydney Duncan and elder sister Sheila Clough Whitfield. Sydney was very well known in the area where for over half a century he played a major role in public life; in the Boy Scouts Association, a Sunday school teacher at Haverton Hill where he was born, a lay preacher at St Cuthbert's, a magistrate, a lay Crown Court Judge, an independent councillor for Haverton Hill, and Chairman of BUDC. It was the building of Billingham baths by the BUDC in 1934 on Cowpen Lane that gave the impetus to children wanting to learn to swim. Swimming became part of the school curriculum and weekly day time sessions were allocated to local schools. In addition swimming sessions were allocated to local industry. The Furness Shipbuilding Company's heavily subsidised session for example was the last session on a Friday night. Their workers children, including me and my eldest sister, were given a book of tickets which allowed access to the hour long session. Unfortunately these tickets didn't also provide for a free mug of the excellent Bovril and cracker biscuit, whose smell at least, all who went to the baths will delightfully remember. These sessions were well organised by Mr Harding, a shipwright in the Yard. After the Friday night session, some of us children, including Eddie Holroyd and Joan Harding whose brother was an excellent swimmer and one of the team, would go onto the small balcony to watch water polo, particularly as Haverton Hill had some excellent swimmers, most of whom were also regulars at Billingham Beck.

The construction of the old baths is interesting. In the 1970s although the new baths were up and running at the Forum, I, along with my brother in law Keith McGregor were regulars at the old ones on Saturday afternoons. It was quiet, swimmers were few and we got to know the staff. On one visit we were shown around the baths to those areas not normally seen by the public so to speak. We walked around the outside perimeter of the bath where we could pear through the underwater portholes and see the swimmers. We were told that any inappropriate underwater behaviour was quickly routed out. Apparently the basic design of the bath left a lot to be desired. Dead areas at the access cut out's in the sides of the bath and particularly, and most importantly, the shallow children's area, were not properly flushed during the flushing cycle, where for obvious reasons, these were the very areas that needed good flushing. This led to higher chlorination costs to try to minimise possible stomach problems,

clearly not ideal compared with the superior design of the Forum baths.

When shortly after the old baths closed, it brought to an end a historic building in the story of BUDC.

Ah, those long gone summers of yesteryear! Heralded in with sandshoes, nothing fancy, either black or white, on sale in shops like Bob the Jews in Haverton Hill, the emergence of tops and whips and home made toffee apples. As fast as they came in they would disappear only to emerge next year.
