Section One

Show entry forms registration forms are available from the show Marquee

- 1 Liability for loss or damage. Organisers accept no responsibility for the safety of exhibits or other property. All reasonable precautions against theft or damage will be taken, but exhibits will be staged at the owners' risk.
- 2. The exhibitor must have grown all exhibits, 25p per entry, a limit of 2 entries per class.
- 3. Entries accepted for staging: Friday 8th September, from 1.00pm until 7.00pm and Saturday 9th September, from 7.00am until 10.00am in the marquee.
- 4 Exhibitors must supply their own vases and other necessary material. A vase is taken to mean a container, which has maximum open diameter of 6" or a surface area of 28 square inches if of another shape.
- 4. Only persons authorised by the Show Committee will be permitted in the marquee during judging.
- 5. Exhibits must not be removed until 3.00pm on Sunday 10th September without express permission of the Show Committee; all exhibits should be removed before 4.00pm.
- 6. Judging- All judging will take place during the morning of Saturday 9th September 2019 the judge's decision will be final.
- 7. Admission: The show will be open to the public and exhibitors from 1pm to 5pm on Saturday 9th September 2022 and from 10am to 3pm on Sunday 11th

Prizes will be presented at 2.30pm on Sunday 10th September 2022

70th Billingham Craft Show

The 70th Billingham Craft Show will include classes to reflect this special year and some of the events taking place in Billingham in 2023

There will be a special class to enable adults and children to submit work that was created for the 2022 show which sadly had to be cancelled following the death of Queen Elizabeth 2nd. Any work produced specifically for that event can be included in this years show and will be placed in a class of its own. See class lists for specific details.

70 years ago, many people struggled financially much as they do today and would often 'make do and mend' to get by. People are rediscovering this need today. More people are making and baking at home because of rising costs alongside an increasing interest in conservation, reducing landfill and food waste.

Many volunteer groups and charities have taken on a supporting role to meet the needs of our communities. Through some of the show classes we will raise awareness of a few charities that benefit from the kind of items made for shows such as this to support their work. (All entries will remain the property of the maker). Anyone wishing to pass items to charity will be given details of the charities they might wish to support.

It is not the purpose of the show to make items specifically for a charity but to showcase your own creative skills using ideas taken from charities operating in our area.

If you would like details on how to support them with your knitting, sewing and crochet skills you will be able to pick up information from the craft show in the civic show tent.

Billingham will be host to the Festival of Thrift in 2023 and some classes will include references to thrifting and sustainability. There is also a link to the Billingham International Folklore Festival in some classes.

There will be a specific class for 16 to 18 year olds to encourage this age group to participate and display their talent at the show. An under 3's class has also been included. Paper plates for the under 3's class can be collected from Billingham library, Billingham Town Council and the Café in John Whitehead Park.

70th Billingham Craft Show Rules

1 Liability for loss or damage — organisers accept no responsibility for safety of exhibits or other property. Exhibits will be staged at owner's risk. All reasonable precautions against theft or damage will be taken to prevent risk.

2 Judging—will be made by an independent panel and their decision is final. All exhibits are anonymous to ensure a fair and independent judging process. Judging of exhibits will take place between 10am and 12 noon on Saturday 9th September. Only persons authorised by craft show committee members will be allowed in craft show area of the civic marquee during judging times. Only one 1st 2nd & 3rd prize will be awarded in each class. Certificates and prize will be awarded only if the judges are satisfied with the standard of exhibits. Best in show prizes are awarded at the discretion of the Judges.

Craft Show Winners - presentations will take place in the civic marquee on Sunday 10th at 3pm

3 Entry Form—Entry forms can be found within this brochure and may be reproduced if you require additional class entries.

4 Exhibits - must be first-time showing in Billingham Craft Show

5 **Children** - Items in the children's classes should be the work of the child. Guidance but not assistance may be given by an adult.

6 Entry numbers - may be limited if a particular class is oversubscribed

7 Entry fees - per exhibit are: adults £1 all children's exhibits are - Free

8 **Craft Show Exhibits** must be registered with the official entry form from this brochure. Forms should be handed to a show committee member in the Civic Marquee between 2 pm and 6pm on Friday 8th September 2022 prior to placement of exhibits in the show marquee. Exhibitors must leave the show marquee by 6:15 pm. Baked goods and Flower exhibits must be registered during this time but must not be placed on the show tables until 9.30 am on Saturday 9th. Exhibitors must leave the marquee before 9.50am on that day. If floral art exhibitors require more time please contact the show manager to arrange a time.

9 Exhibits can be removed only after the winner presentations on Sunday afternoon.

10 Entries and prizes that are not removed by 4.30 pm will be removed by the show organisers.
